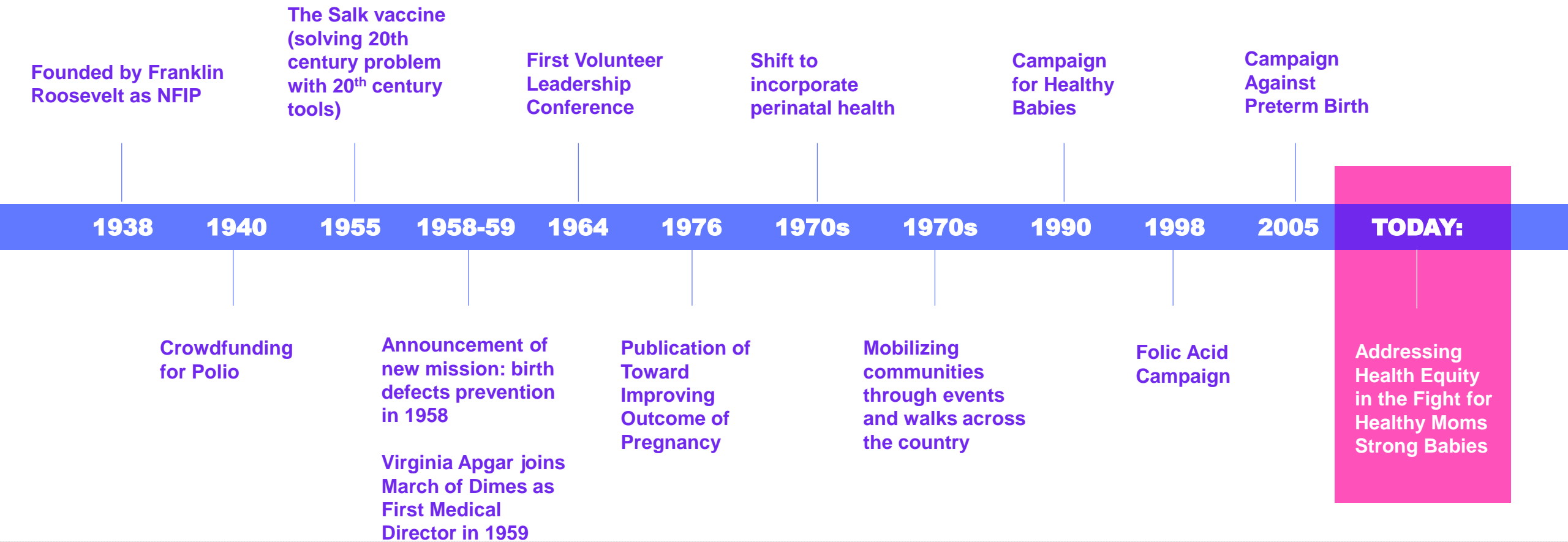

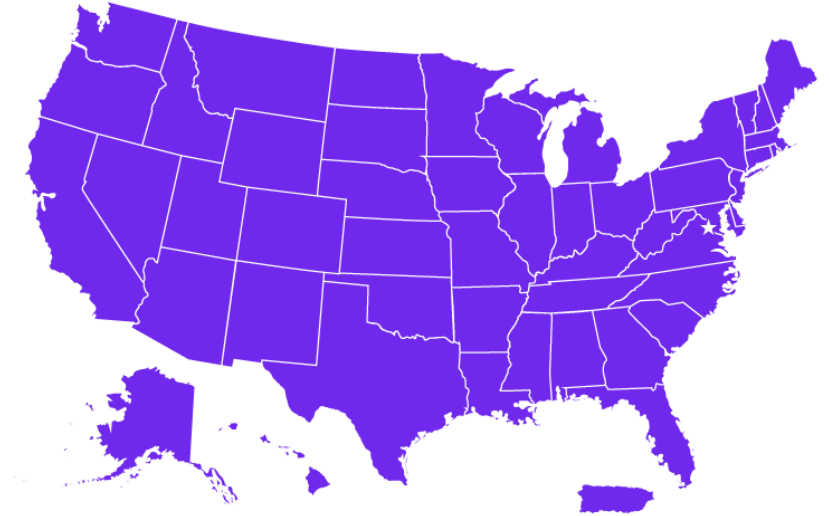

THE U.S. IS THE MOST DANGEROUS COUNTRY IN THE DEVELOPED WORLD TO GIVE BIRTH



2 women will die from pregnancy-related causes today. And every day.

2 babies die every hour in the U.S.

Pregnancy-related deaths have more than doubled over the past 25 years.

5 million women live in maternity care deserts – counties with no hospitals offering obstetric services.

A HIDDEN ISSUE

1 in **500**

youth under 20 in the U.S. have Type 1 diabetes.

1 in **285**

children in the U.S. will be diagnosed with cancer before their 20th birthday.

1 in **59**

children is diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder (ASD) according to the CDC in 2018.

1 in **10**

babies is born too soon in the U.S.

Newborn deaths account for **40%** of all deaths among children under 5.



THERE IS A HIGHER CHANCE OF MATERNAL DEATH OR PRETERM BIRTH BASED ON RACE/ETHNICITY

Women of color are up to 50% more likely to experience a preterm birth compared to white women.

Their children can face a 130% higher infant death rate.

In the U.S. black women have maternal death rates 3x higher than women of other races or ethnicities.

American Indian/Alaska Native women experience the second highest rates of pregnancy-related deaths.

PERSONAL CARE KITS

What is it?

This activity puts together personal care kits for parents whose babies were born too soon, or unexpectedly.

These kits can make a huge impact on the well-being of parents whose babies are in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU)/hospital site due to pregnancy-related complications.

Why is it important?

Becoming a parent can be an exciting and challenging time. But when mom and baby are in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) or at the hospital unexpectedly, it can also become scary for families. Too many moms and dads are experiencing this today and a meaningful gift like this is impactful during one of the most uncertain times in a parent's life.

HOW YOU CAN DO IT:

- Assign a lead:** Assign a lead to this engagement and to liaison with March of Dimes.
- Get connected:** Connect with your March of Dimes staff contact listed at the bottom of this page to let them know you're interested in providing personal care kits to a NICU/hospital partner and [signup](#).
 - Your March of Dimes staff contact will reach out to the March of Dimes NICU Family Support Team/Market Staff to determine a hospital site in your area that you or your group can partner with. **It's important to connect the March of Dimes staff contact first.** Depending on the relationship with the site, you or your group might work directly with a contact at the hospital or through the local March of Dimes staff contact.
- Make a plan:** Once you have a contact, check out the volunteer checklist on the back and start answering the first set of questions with your group of volunteers.
- Define it:** After you've answered the first set of questions and have an idea of what you'd like to do, reconnect with your primary contact and work through the second set of questions on the checklist.
- Secure it:** Purchase items or secure donations/gift cards as needed.
- Do it:** Pack or host a packing party and drop the kits off at the determined NICU/hospital site.
- Celebrate:** ~~Send~~ ^{Share} out thank you emails/notes to the people that participated and to the staff who helped at the hospital.
- Be counted:** Let us know you've taken this action and give us feedback by [fill out this form](#).

Please note that each NICU/hospital partner has different requirements of volunteers. Some hospitals might require volunteer training to access the facility.

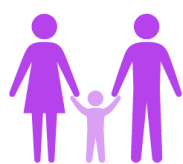

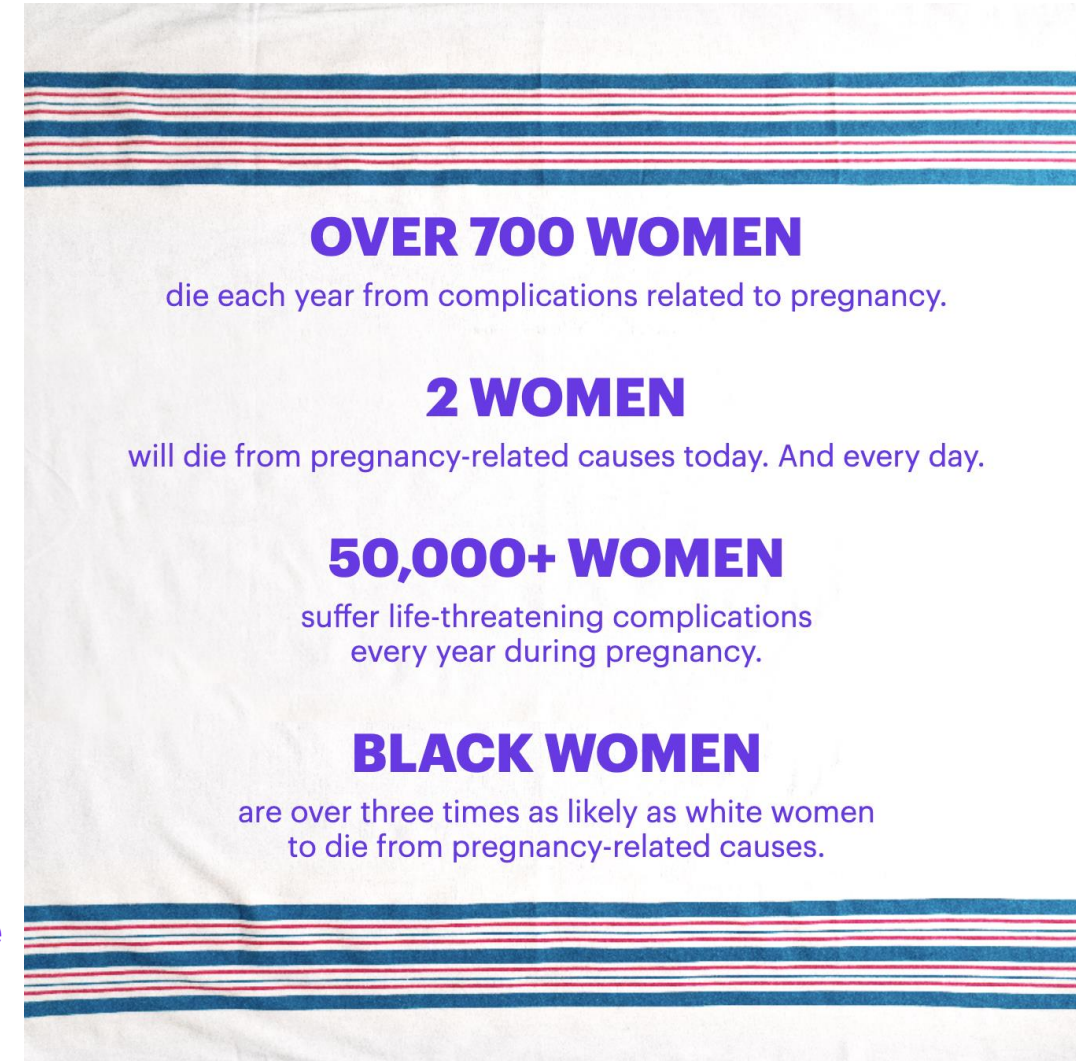
BLANKET CHANGE
